Professional Fund – Allowable/Unallowable Expenses

Allowable Expenses:

- Reimbursement for food will be allowed if it is used as an instructional item (i.e., cornstarch for science experiments, M&M's for math manipulatives).
- Book purchases of over 4 copies per title must follow the guidelines of the Instructional Materials Committee.
- District approved software and technology purchases are allowed. See portal for approved list at http://portalnew.lwsd.org/district-information/technology.
- Home internet is allowed. If you have a bundled bill, note the portion that is for the internet. <u>A flat amount of \$50 per month, up to \$600 annually, may be claimed. You must provide a complete bill for the 1st month and a summary bill for all subsequent months with your claim.
 </u>
- Cell phone internet is allowed for your device or phone. If you have a bundled bill, note the portion that is your
 phone number's data plan only. <u>A flat amount of \$41.67 per month, up to \$500 annually, may be claimed. You
 must provide a complete bill for the 1st month and a summary bill for all subsequent months with your claim.
 </u>
- Workshop/Conference registrations are allowed.
- Tuition for classes related to your current or potential assignment, as per IRS regulations, is allowed. Books required for these classes **cannot** be reimbursed
- National Board payments are allowed. Proof that payment was made between June 1, 2018 and May 31, 2019 is required.
- Reimbursements for student loans are allowed **ONLY if the student loan was incurred** <u>after</u> employment (per IRS regulations). Documentation must show the date when the loan was incurred and proof that loan payments were made between June 1, 2018 and May 31, 2019 is required
- Reimbursement for dues paid to non-required professional educational organizations (e.g. ASCD, NCSS, ASCA, AASL, LWEA, WEA NEA, etc.). Proof that payment was made between June 1, 2018 and May 31, 2019 is required.
- Teachers may pool funds to purchase a higher cost item. Please submit reimbursement forms to Accounts Payable together as one package.

Unallowable Expenses:

- Food, decorations, and other items for school parties are not allowed.
- Travel expenses such as transportation, mileage, meals and lodging are not allowed.
- Payment for student field trips is not allowed.
- Payment for guest speakers, assemblies, etc. is not allowed.
- The cost of substitutes for release time is not allowed.
- Materials for personal use or purchases for gifts/donations are not allowed under state law.
- Furniture purchases are not allowed.

Professional Fund – Common Questions

Q. How much can I count from my dues?

A. If you are currently working at the same FTE now as you were in June of last year, then read the chart below to determine the amount you can include:

FTE	3 MONTHS IN 2017-18	9 MONTHS IN 2018-19	TOTAL
.76 - 1.0	270.84	835.56	1106.40
.5175	237.03	732.60	969.65
.2650	141.27	430.92	572.19
.125	97.17	296.46	393.63

Q. When can I start spending money on materials and other items?

A. Any expenses incurred from June 1, 2018 through May 31, 2019 qualify for the fund.

Q. If my FTE was different or I was not working in 2017-18, how will I determine my dues amount?

A. You should contact Sheila Hagerman in the LWEA office for assistance.

Q. Will I get a receipt to include with my reimbursement form?

A. Yes, you will receive a receipt from the LWEA in the Spring to use for this purpose.

Q. Do I have to save receipts for purchases?

A. Yes. Also, the state auditor prohibits personal items from being on the same receipts as those you turn in for your Professional Fund. Make sure you get a separate receipt for your purchases, and don't co-mingle your personal purchases with Professional Fund purchases. You'll be asked to turn in all your receipts once you've spent all the money, but no later than May 31, 2019.
