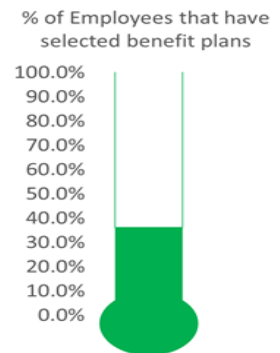
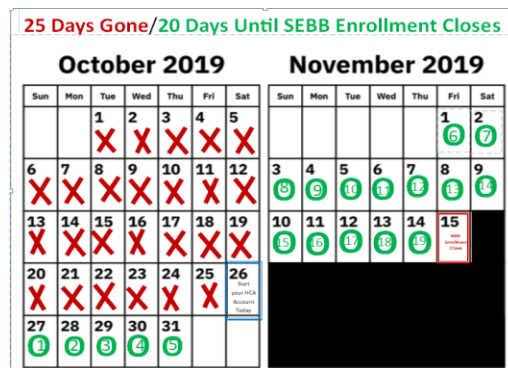
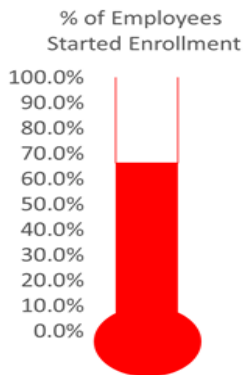

SEBB: Time Is Running Out



Where do you fall?

- 2,368 employees have started their SEBB enrollment by creating an account
- 1,289 employees have selected their SEBB plans
- 1,079 employees (approximately) have done nothing

With only 21 days until SEBB Enrollment Closes....why wait? Create your account NOW.

To set up an account go to myaccount.hca.wa.gov

HELPFUL HINTS:

1. You do not have to complete your enrollment all at once.
2. You can work in small increments (15 minutes at a time)
3. You can **make changes to your account anytime** through Nov. 15

Waive Your Medical Benefits?..... Want to Continue to Waive?

If you do not want medical coverage under SEBB, **you must actively opt-out to WAIVE medical benefits** to avoid being defaulted into a plan with a monthly premium.

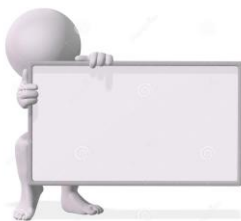
