

## SEBB Open Enrollment Success!!

**REMINDER:** Before your current plans expire on December 31, 2019:

- Access your NBN Vision benefit for yourself and dependents. The current NBN plan is an excellent plan that entitles you and your dependents to an exam and glasses (or contacts in lieu of) once every 365 days, paid in full.
- Submit all Rx – fill any eligible prescriptions before SEBB begins on 1/1/2020.



## Work Day Prior to Thanksgiving Break .....

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In recognition of last year’s changes to the elementary work day, the association has again come to an agreement with the district on the staff workday for November 27, 2019 and the last of school for the 2019-2020 school year. That agreement reads as follows.

Section 9.5.1 states: “August LEAP - A minimum of twelve (12) hours of Individual Teacher Work time will be given during August LEAP; five and a half (5.5) hours of Individual Teacher Work will be given on the first day of August LEAP. The other six and a half (6.5) hours will be decided collaboratively at the building level by the Building Leadership Team in blocks of no less than two (2) hours. **In addition, three and a half (3.5) hours shall be worked at the teacher’s discretion for planning and preparation, in lieu of working three and a half (3.5) hours on the day before Thanksgiving.”**

**The 3.5 hours, in addition to a duty-free lunch, would cause elementary staff to leave prior to the end of the student day. Due to supervision requirements and contract requirements, we have entered into an agreement to accommodate supervision and contractual requirements.**

**LWEA and LWSD Agreement:**

Elementary staff will receive their compensatory 3.5 hours in the following manner:

- *November 27, 2019:* 3 hours early release
- *Last day of school:* .5 hours early release



## Graduation Pathways Survey – from WEA

After years of persistent and passionate input from WEA members, the Legislature passed a bill last session to de-link standardized test scores from high-school graduation. Beginning this year, students can still take and pass the Smarter Balanced test (SBAC) but also have several other [pathways](#) to achieve graduation. Students graduating in 2020 can still file for a [waiver from the testing requirement](#) if they don't achieve the scores necessary to graduate.

We were successful in reducing the high-stakes nature of the standardized test. But the new pathways are just that, new. WEA was instrumental in ensuring a review and evaluation process as part of the rollout of the new pathways. We wanted to assess which options are available in our districts, determine if they are adequate for our students and ensure that the pathways don't have unintended consequences for the students they are meant to support. The State Board of Education is conducting a [short survey](#) seeking its first round of input about the graduation pathways.

It is important for WEA members to provide input into the [survey](#), so educators' voices are heard and counted. As educators who work directly with students, we have the best insights about what works, and what doesn't, for our students.

The [survey](#) takes about five minutes to complete, and **closes on Friday, Nov. 22.**

They are joyful relics of family moments, and everyday products invented or patented by African Americans – the ironing board, cell phone technology, golf tees, and a pencil sharpener. They are also the crude reminders of a painful past: A runaway slave collar – circa 1800. Branding irons. Shackles. A shotgun. All are equally displayed in The Unspoken Truths African American Museum.

The "Unspoken" Truths American History Traveling Museum chronicles the rich history of Africans in Africa prior to American Chattel Slavery, the experiences and impact of American Chattel Slavery, Jim Crow Era, and the many contributions African Americans have had on scientific, cultural, and technological (inventions) innovations in the U.S. and the world."
