More PFML FAQ's

As we receive answers to your questions, we will continue to collaborate with the district and update the PFML FAQ sheet. In this version you will find answers to these questions beginning on page 3:

- When I go on PFML, will my benefits be maintained?
- If I take an unpaid leave, will I lose my SEBB benefits?
- I thought all I needed was 630 hours to qualify for benefits?
- If I am on leave, what hours will be counted toward the 630 hours that establish SEBB eligibility?
- When will my benefits restart after my leave?
- If I took FMLA in 2019, but want to use PFML now, will my benefits be maintained at their current level?
- Can I take intermittent leave?
- Will my state PFML benefit be reduced if I take sick leave at the same time?
