We are asking you to defer approving and purchasing English Language Arts Curriculum. Educators need to be prioritized over books. Purchasing \$5-million in new curriculum means money will be taken from elsewhere. Students will bear the burden if new curriculum is purchased; adding another \$5-million to the already devastating deficit will mean students will see an increased loss of educators in their schools.

We recognize curriculum hasn't been purchased in 20-years—this is not the year to make such a hefty investment. The investment made will be on the backs of students who will benefit more from stable relationships with educators than from new books.

The board and school district has publicly said they will prioritize and protect educators in this budgeting process. Purchasing curriculum is counter to this public commitment. Our message is simple: **Educators Not Books**.
