Work Email and the Use of Personal Devices for Work



What you should know:

- Anything that creates a "record" related to teaching is subject to a public records request. This includes your work email and the use of a personal device in relation to teaching.
- If you don't want the District or the general public to read something, keep it off your work email.
- If you use a **personal device** for **public work** then it could be subject to disclosure and public records requests. To make your life easier, find a way to archive the work-related "records" (files, documents, pictures) that you create on your personal device so that you can easily locate and turn them over if asked by the District.

Professional Funds 2020-21

Most of your Professional Fund questions can be answered by reading your Professional Fund form and reviewing the district PF Q&A LWSD Only after reviewing, if you still have questions, please send to askprofessionalfund@lwsd.org Eligibility questions should go to Tyler Harris. If you want to take less than your eligible amount, you will need to email Tyler Harris.

Guidelines:

- Deadline to submit Professional Funds receipts is June 1, 2021. Don't wait begin gathering your documentation for submission.
- Accumulate receipts up to allowable amount and submit any time prior to the deadline.
- Purchases must be made between June 1, 2020 and May 31, 2021.
- Purchases must be on a separate itemized receipt and cannot contain other personal items.
- All materials purchased will remain the property of the District.

Allowable Expenses:

- Home internet, you can claim \$50/month. It does not matter if bundled amount is more or less.
- Cell phone data, you can claim \$41.67/month. It does not matter if bundles amount is more or less.
- Union dues, simply complete the LWEA Dues Receipt. <u>LWEA Dues Receipt</u>




Non-profit, STEM-IB Summer Program Teacher Position

Christine Winterbrook - K5HC Team Member in Accelerated Programs – Supports Rosa Parks Elementary and Sandburg/Discovery Elementary School Highly Capable Students. Christine is currently undergoing chemotherapy and recovering from radiation therapy for Stage IV non-small cell lung cancer with the EGFR mutation which is a non-smoker's form of lung cancer. In November, she was found to have a metastatic tumor in her spine and underwent 10 cycles of radiation during winter break. The radiation caused increased inflammation that resulted in a blood clot near her spine. Shortly after radiation ended, it was discovered that a tumor in her lung had active cancer and she has now started 4 rounds (12 weeks) of chemotherapy.
