Virtual BEST Spring Symposium 2022



The Virtual BEST Spring Symposium is comprised of two events: The Mentor/Coach Equity in Action Conference and the BEST Grantee Convening. The Mentor/Coach Equity in Action Conference is open to all Washington state public-school mentors, coaches, educator leaders, and others who support novice educator induction. The BEST Grantee Convening is open only to current BEST Grantee teams.

The 2022 OSPI BEST Symposium registration is now open to the public. The Mentor/Coach Equity Conference is on March 9th and 10th. Several of our Nakia facilitators are presenting breakout sessions and are facilitating racial caucusing, and Brooke Brown is one of our keynotes.

Pre-school; K-5; 6-8; 9-12


Friends in Need
