


# Update - Stay Connected

## **Updated Safety Protocols in Our Schools**

**April 13,2022** 

**COVID-19 safety measures** remain layered in our schools and fall into two types: *requirements* and *strategies*. You can read about LWSD's layered approach in the latest <u>Pathway Forward</u> message. We want members to be informed about these changes.




Vaccinations: members have access to paid leave for vaccine appointments and when experiencing side effects from vaccine administration.

**Leave for Covid events**: members have access to paid leave and release time for covid events (mandatory isolation and covid childcare events). **Review our LOU** for more information.

Access to testing: members have access to free testing by appointment.

## Have remaining safety questions?

#### Members have multiple avenues for support on Covid safety in buildings:

- Site supervisors: each building has a Covid site supervisor. Usually this is a building administrator. First reach out to your site supervisor to discuss Covid safety concerns that you might have.
- Safety committees: <u>by law</u>, safety committees are a forum for employees to review and correct safety
  hazards, including illness prevention. Contact the certificated staff on the safety committee for help resolving
  Covid safety concerns.
- Building labor management: building reps can discuss unresolved Covid safety concerns in building labor management. Contact your building reps to discuss your safety concerns and how they might be resolved.
- If you've worked through your site supervisor, your safety committee, and your building labor management process but your Covid safety concerns remain unresolved, contact us at <a href="mailto:asklwea@washingtonea.org">asklwea@washingtonea.org</a>.

All nominations must be made by a member of the Lake Washington Education Association in good standing. Self-nomination is allowed. <u>To be eligible for any position</u>, nominee must be a member in good standing.



Did you know that the emails you have received addressed to "Employee \_\_\_\_\_" are not legitimate? Some of you may have received 15+ similar emails over the past two years. The subject line of the email refers to "retirement plans," "benefit evaluations," "important information," etc.

During the pandemic, high-cost 403b salespeople did not have direct access to schools or public employees, and they started to solicit customers through email. These emails are often addressed to "Employee \_\_\_\_" These emails may tell you that "you are eligible to review your retirement benefit questions." If you click on the link to sign up for an appointment, your contact information will be given to someone who is <u>not</u> a retirement specialist but is a salesperson who will attempt to sign you up for a high-cost 403b plan.

The WA Department of Retirement Services does not contact individuals to set up a meeting to review your retirement options. These emails are sent from lead generation companies who want to obtain your contact information. Here is an example of an email below.

I have had the opportunity to meet with many of your co-workers over this last school year to review their pension, and I am making sure I am reaching out to help you with yours as well! Let's schedule a time to meet this summer.

Covid-19 continues to cause many challenges and disruptions, and as a school district employee, it is very important you meet with a benefits specialist. There are 3 different plans within the district, and it is very important for us to review your specific TRS/DRS benefits and all other district-approved options.
