SIOP Cohorts for Certificated Elementary and Secondary Classroom Teachers

This cohort is designed for participants who are interested in taking a deeper dive into one of the components of SIOP and implementing it in their practice. Cohort participants will work collaboratively to design instruction, using SIOP strategies, that directly impacts student growth. Teacher teams will analyze evidence of learning and reflect on instructional shifts to meet student needs.

The cohort consists of 3 in-person meetings and an option for 1 asynchronous hour of additional collaboration. It is beneficial to sign up with a content-area team member, but not required. Participants will be paid LWSD timecard rate and are eligible to earn up to 5 clock hours. Sign up on Cornerstone.


