What is a micro-credential?

A micro-credential is a short, competency-based recognition that allows an educator to demonstrate knowledge or skill in a particular area. **No cost to WEA members and clock hours are available.**

Micro-credentials are available of interest to a wide variety of roles — substitute teacher, teacher, ESA, ESP and more. Certain micro-credentials meet the STEM and equity requirements. Grounded in research and best practice, and created by educators for educators, NEA Micro-credentials are flexible--you can study when it's convenient for you, alone or with your peers, and develop your own learning based on your interests and goals.

National Board Certification is the highest credential in the teaching profession and is a voluntary process established by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS). Certification is a one- to five-year process and according to the <u>NBPTS</u>, completing the certification shows that each teacher knows and practices "the definitive standards of accomplished teaching."

The National Board's **Maintenance of Certification** (MOC) process is designed based on best assessment practices and by teachers to ensure that National Board Certified Teachers continue to grow professionally while maintaining a strong impact on student learning.
