## **Breaking News from Olympia**

Monday was the last day for bills to pass out of fiscal committees, which means we now have a sense of which bills are moving forward this session and which bills have failed.

### 3 big headlines from yesterday's legislative action:

- 1. ESP staffing bills (<u>HB 1960</u> and <u>SB 5882</u>) are moving forward but were significantly amended. They now increase staffing only for instructional paraeducators and only for one year.
- 2. ESP pay bills did not make yesterday's deadline. We need to regroup and build an even stronger push for passing this in the 2025 session.
- 3. Several of our priorities are still moving, including increasing the special education cap (SB 6014).

#### This is mostly disappointing news.

- While the ESP staffing bills moved forward, they were significantly pared back by the committees so their impact will be diminished.
- ESP staff need adequate pay, respect, and funding.
- Public schools in Washington are not yet fully funded.

#### Key take-aways:

- Improving ESP staffing and pay is shaping up to be a multi-year fight.
- Members will need to continue to speak out on behalf of students and schools.

Today is the 32nd day of the 2024 Legislative session. The next cutoff date is February 13 - the last day for passing bills of out of the chamber of origin. Bills that make the February 13 cutoff will go through a similar process in the opposite house.

Feb 5 last day for bills to pass out of committee

Feb 13 last day for bills to pass out of house of origin

Feb 26 last day for bills from opposite house to pass out of committee

Mar 1 last day to pass bills from opposite house

Mar 7 last day of regular session
