Political Scene Undate

The legislative session ends today. This was a short legislative session, which means that only supplemental changes were made to the 2023–2025 two-year budget. Next year during the long legislative session a new two-year budget will be passed.

What did we win this year?

WEA members won more funding for our key priorities. Many WEA members reached out to their elected leaders and shared their stories. The result of that advocacy is more funding in the supplemental budget for special education and ESP staffing. <u>Read more here</u>.

Do you know?

Our legislature alternates each year between long (100 day) session and short (60 day) sessions. In the long session, they pass a two-year budget. In the short years, they only pass supplemental changes to the budget. Think of supplemental changes as "fixes" to their two-year budget. In both sessions, they can both amend existing legislation and pass new legislation.

Is that good?

It's a good start! Our students desperately need more supports at school. We will need to keep asking for more staffing in our schools and for full funding of special education.

Are we done?

Sadly, no. Public education is not yet fully funded in Washington. Please continue to <u>speak</u> <u>with your elected leaders</u> and share your stories with them. They need to hear from front-line educators about the needs of students and staff in schools today.
