Importance of Date(s) for Certs Retiring This Year



Retiring from the District (Separate Service) vs Retiring with DRS

Understand the importance of and implications of your **retirement date**. Things to consider:

- Benefits end the same month that you retire (separate) from the district.
- You receive a full service credit with DRS if you complete your contract regardless of the date you retire from the district.
- If an employee separates from service June 30th Retirement date with DRS is 7/1 and SEBB benefits stop on June 30th
- If an employee separates from service August 5th-Retirement date with DRS is 9/1 and SEBB benefits stop on August 31st.
- If an employee retires with DRS on July 1st they will be eligible for the DRS COLA the following July 1st.
- If an employee retires with DRS on September 1st, they are not eligible for COLA the next July, as they have not been retired one year. The COLA they missed gets banked for future use.
