Compensation Changes for 2024-2025

Be on the lookout for 3 changes to compensation coming next year:

Timecard Rate

The timecard rate for 2024-25 will increase from \$55/hour to \$60/hour. You can review our language for purpose and use of the timecard rate in **20.4.5** of the CBA.

Cost of Living Adjustment

Next year's COLA for K-12 educators is 3.7%. This was secured as part of the 23-24 supplemental legislative budget - political action matters! During the 2023 legislative session we successfully lobbied for <u>a more reliable approach to determining COLA</u> year to year.

Salary Matrix, Sub Rates, and Stipends for 24–25

Next year's CBA documents related to salary (Appendix A, salary matrix; Appendix C, substitutes; Appendix D, stipend schedule) will be available by the end of June. Once ready, we will post to the LWEA website. COLA is applied to the base salary, responsibility, and LEAP pay; sub rates; and stipends.
