
Educator Losses in Buying Power

Because, year after year, school employee salaries in Washington have been stagnant (or declined) while inflation has continued to grow, classified educational staff would need a 12.2% pay increase and certificated educational staff would need a 13.5% pay increase *just to regain lost purchasing power over the last several years*. ^{1,2,3}



^{1. 2008-09} is used as the base year, and LID days eliminated in 2009-10 and 2010-11 are included as compensation losses for the purposes of this chart.

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^{2.} Certificated positions require teaching certificates (teachers, nurses, guidance counselors, and others).

^{3.} Classified positions do not require teaching certificates but often require other training and credentials (paraeducators, janitors, bus drivers, office assistants, and others).
